A big THANK YOU to Tom & Sue Gamache for once again hosting our pre-show gathering and caravan to Corvettes at the Summit. There were approximately 80 Corvettes in attendance and all were really nice cars.

Stef & I missed the all Corvette show & swap meet at the Gilmore Museum, Hickory Corners, MI due to our trip to Ventura. Michigan Chapter members Mike & Chris McLain did well as event organizers.

The 2018 SACC Convention in Ventura, CA from July 20-22 was an outstanding event. There were 153 registered guests & 60 Corvettes. Only about 10 were newer cars. From the Northwest chapter, 12 C-1s convoyed to the convention, 10 made it there. Attendees came from as far away as Massachusetts and two C1s were towed from Florida. Four couples from Washington State had a car hauler take their C1s back and they returned home via a train.

The evening Harbor Dinner Cruise and truly spectacular sunsets over the Pacific Ocean were sufficient to make the trip worthwhile. We took a cruise east to Thousand Oaks, CA to the Malamut Auto and 1950's Museum. The owner threw us a pizza party, so lunch was "on the house". What stood out? A '67 Nassau Blue big block conv; a pair of '63s- a conv and an injected split window; a '47 Pontiac woody wagon; a '57 Bel-Air Conv; a '54 Mercedes gullwing; a 220 Mercedes cabriolet; a S120 Jaguar and an Amphibicar.

Larry Pearson, a SoCal member, did a tech session on C1 Rochester Fuel Injection inspection markings,. Eric Hershkowitz, a SoCal member and retired dentist, gave out sample tool kits as well as a very informative tech session on cleaning lube tips. Unfortunately, I had to leave the bag of lubricating & painting tips hypodermic syringes behind. There was no way to get it past airport.

Jim Gessner, co-founder of Registry for Corvette Racing, presented a slideshow of Corvette race cars from 1956 thru 1963. Jim was joined by 3 race car owners/drivers (Paul Reinhart, Joe Frietas & Fred Yerkel) who actually raced the cars represented in his presentation. Joe also raced Cobras for Carrol Shelby but still owns his #77 '57 race car that he recently raced at Monterey in a Memorial race.



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Solid Axle Corvette Club

The Solid Axle Corvette Club is for enthusiasts who drive and show America's first sports car., our beloved C1's. The Solid Axle Corvette Club invites you to share our enthusiasm and dedication to the Solid Axle Corvettes, and to enjoy the fellowship of our members.

SACC is the initials of the Solid Axle Corvette Club. So, just what is a solid axle Corvette? The rear axle housing on all 1953 to 1962 Corvettes was a one-piece shell. The rear differential (rear gears) and the axles were mounted within this rear axle housing. (The rear axle housing is sometimes called a solid [or straight] axle housing.)

Beginning with the 1963 model year, Corvettes had an independent rear suspension (IRS). The rear differential is built into the center housing: universal joints and short shafts (called jack shafts) transfer power to the rear wheels. Each rear wheel reacts independently to the road surface, and has earned the nickname "rubber axle".

The Solid Axle Corvette Club (SACC) is a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation, care, history, and enjoyment of the 1953 to 1962 Corvettes. Ours is a family oriented club with membership covering all members of your family. You do not need to own a Corvette to join.

Road Rules

The *Michigan* is the quarterly newsletter for the Michigan Chapter of the Solid Axle Corvette Club and is published four times yearly (Spring, Summer, Fall & Winter). It is published in PDF format, emailed to members in good standing.

Membership in the Michigan Chapter is open *only* to members of the parent organization, the Solid Axle Corvette Club. The Solid Axle Corvette Club is a non-profit organization, serving members with an interest in 1953—1962 model year Corvettes.
